MEET REVD JOYCE NORMAN – A PIONEER IN MISSION, MINISTRY AND...METALLURGY

Just as L S Lowry was a pioneer of northern art, fellow Salfordian Revd Joyce Norman is a pioneer of women in mission. Born in the land of 'matchstalk men and matchstalk cats and dogs', she went on to embrace the world.

Joyce's Salford story reflects the Lowry print that hangs in her MMHS home. 'You could play happily in the streets because there was very little transport,' she recalled. 'The milk was delivered by horse and cart. It was just a nice, friendly place.'

Born into the McQueeney family, she went on to earn a scholarship for grammar school: 'I had this great interest in science'. Leaving school in 1952, she became a
